YES, YOU WILL HAVE the opportunity to win Les Edwards' original painting on the cover of this *Progress Report* (originally published in 1976 on the *Fifth Mayflower Book of Black Magic Stories* edited by Michel Parry). When you arrive at the Registration Desk to collect your delegate bag and badge, a coloured raffle ticket with a number on it will be included with your event materials. If you take that ticket along to Les' Guest of Honour Presentation on the Sunday morning, at some point during the hour he will pick the winner. However, you (or a representative) have to be there to qualify.

## **GETTING TO BRIGHTON**

FOR THOSE ATTENDEES arriving from overseas, you will probably be flying in to either Heathrow or Gatwick airports. Upon arrival at Heathrow, you need to follow the signs to the Underground (<a href="http://journeyplanner.tfl.gov.uk">http://journeyplanner.tfl.gov.uk</a>) and the Piccadilly Line (dark blue). You will need to take the tube to Green Park and there change onto the Victoria Line (light blue) and travel one stop south to Victoria Station.

From Victoria you need to buy a ticket for a

Southern train (www.southernrailway.com) to Brighton. Advance-purchase tickets are available at a cheaper rate and trains run approximately every half-hour with a journey time of just over 50 minutes.

First Capital Connect also run trains to Brighton from London Bridge, which connects to the Northern (black) tube line. There are four an hour with an average journey time on just over an hour (www.firstcapitalconnect.com). You can also get a First Capital Connect train to Brighton from St. Pancras International with a direct link from Eurostar.

If you fly directly into Gatwick, then you can catch a train from the South Terminal that takes you into Brighton Station in just over half-an-hour.

Once you arrive at the station, walk (or get a taxi from the rank right outside) straight down Queen's Road towards the sea. Once you arrive at King's Road, directly on the seafront, turn left for the Royal Albion and Radisson Blu hotels (they are both opposite the Pier), or right for the Ramada Brighton. It should take you no more than 10-20 minutes.

If you are driving (the A23 is the main London-Brighton road), please note that there are only short-term pay-and-display parking bays outside the Royal Albion and Radisson Blu and, once you have unloaded, you will need to park in one of the city's secure off-street car parks. If you enquire at the Front Desk, they will direct you to the nearest parking facility. There are more details on our website: (www.whc2010.org/hotel-parking01.html).

National Express coaches depart from various locations in London (including Victoria) and arrive directly outside the back of the Royal Albion Hotel at the "Pool Valley" stop. They run every hour and have a journey time of about 2 hours (www.nationalexpress.com).

## **INGRID PITT**

## **Special Guest of Honour**



INGRID PITT is best known to horror film fans as Hammer Film's "Queen of Horror". Her roles in Sound of Horror (aka El sonido la muerte, 1964), The Omegans (1968), The Vampire Lovers (1970), Countess Dracula (1970), The House That Dripped Blood (1970, in an episode based on

Robert Bloch's story 'The Cloak'), The Wicker Man (1973), Artemis 81 (1981), Clive Barker's Underworld (aka Transmutations, 1985), Green Fingers (2000), The Asylum (2000, opposite her daughter Steffanie, who plays the lead), Minotaur (2006), Hammer's Beyond the Rave (2008), Sea of Dust (2009) and the 'Vampirology' episode on the Urban Gothic TV series, have established her as an icon in the horror film genre.

Her latest credit is a new version of Edgar Allen Poe's *The Tell-Tale Heart* (2009), which marks the last screen appearance of Robert ("Count Yorga") Quarry.

The Polish-born actress' other movie credits outside the horror genre include Where Eagles Dare (1969) opposite Richard Burton and Clint Eastwood, Who Dares Wins (aka The Final Option, 1982), Wild Geese II (1985) and Hanna's War (1988). She has also appeared in many TV shows on both sides of the Atlantic, including Ironside, Jason King, Thriller and Doctor Who, and has toured extensively throughout Britain and South America with her own stage company.

She has written The Ingrid Pitt Bedside Companion for Vampire Lovers, The Ingrid Pitt Bedside Companion for Ghosthunters and The Ingrid Pitt Book of Murder, Torture and Depravity. Additionally, she contributed an Introduction and an original story to The Mammoth Book of Vampire Stories by Women, edited by Stephen Jones, and her autobiography, Life's a Scream, was published by Heinemann in 1999. She was short-listed for the Talkies Awards for her own reading of extracts from the audio book.

Ingrid has also written regular columns in such diverse magazines as Shivers, Motoring & Leisure, TV Film Memorabilia, Micro Mart, Femme Fatales, Bite Me, It's Alive and The Cricketer.

She is currently writing a history of Hammer Films for the studio, to be published in 2010, and has recently completed a *Doctor Who* script for Big Finish Productions.

At World Horror Convention 2010, Ingrid Pitt will be selling signed copies of her books, photos, DVDs and other memorabilia. There will also be a fee for her to sign items brought into the event. However, she will not charge to sign copies of the convention's souvenir book and *The Mammoth Book of Vampire Stories by Women*. Please do not embarrass her (or yourself) by asking her to sign any other items for free.

## **JO FLETCHER**

## **Mistress of Ceremonies**



IO FLETCHER was born in 1958 in West London. An editor. writer, poet and iournalist, she has been published widelv throughout the world. Her work has appeared in, amongst other titles. The Mammoth Books of Werewolves, Frankenstein and Dracula, Now We Are Sick, The

Tiger Garden: A Book of Writers' Dreams, Dark of the Night, White of the Moon, Freaks Geeks and Sideshow Floozies, Cthulhu and the CoEds, Short Trips: A Christmas Treasury and Daughter of Dangerous Dames. As "Featured Poet" she contributed a Zodiac cycle to The Urbanite magazine.

Jo has also edited the World Fantasy Convention anthologies Gaslight & Ghosts and Secret City: Strange Tales of London (both with Stephen Jones), along with the mosaic children's novel Horror at Halloween, based around concepts created by the late Charles L. Grant. Her first poetry collection, Shadows of Light and Dark, was short-listed for the British Fantasy Award. Non-fiction work has included The World's Greatest Mysteries and contributions to James Herbert: By Horror Haunted, Reign of Fear and Feast of Fear. She has ghost-written everything from fantasy epics to history books to military memoirs, several of which have been international best-sellers.

Her journalism, which included a decade in Fleet Street as an investigative reporter, won her a number of plaudits, including an Old Bailey High Court Commendation. She has won an International Society of Poets Award in 1996, the British Fantasy Society's inaugural Karl Edward Wagner Award in 1997, and the World Fantasy Award – Professional in 2002.

In 1985 she joined the fledgling independent publishing company Headline and masterminded the launch of Headline's fantasy. SF and horror list, introducing award-winning writers like Dan Simmons, Michael Bishop, and Charlie Grant's acclaimed horror anthology series Shadows to the UK. She left Headline in 1988 and worked for Mandarin (1988-90), then moved to Pan to run the newly revitalised genre list. She is currently Associate Publisher of Gollancz, the award-winning fantasy and science fiction imprint, now part of the Orion Publishing Group, where her authors include such giants of the field as Sir Terry Pratchett, the late Sir Arthur C. Clarke, Ursula K. Le Guin, Gene Wolfe, Neil Gaiman, Stephen Donaldson, Charlaine Harris and Polish superstar Andrzei Sapkowski.


## **HWA LAA WINNERS**

THE HORROR WRITERS ASSOCIATION has chosen two long-time icons of the genre to receive the prestigious Lifetime Achievement Award this year. Given for an author's overall body of work, the award will go to Brian Lumley and to William F. Nolan.

The Lifetime Achievement Award is the most prestigious of the Bram Stoker Awards, given by the HWA in acknowledgement of superior achievement not just in a single work but over an entire career.

Unfortunately, William F. Nolan will be unable to attend the convention due to a prior commitment, but Brian Lumley will be on hand throughout the weekend, and he will be joined by former HWA President Dennis Etchison, who will be the organisation's Special Guest.

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## PROGRAMMING PREVIEW

THE CONVENTION WILL START on the Wednesday evening with an Early Arrivals Reception in the Royal Albion Hotel from 8:00-10:00pm. It is hoped that Early Registration will be available then as well.

From Noon until 5:00pm on the Thursday we will be holding the "Pitch Black" rights fair in the Bar Rogue. A number of publishers, editors and agents will be on hand to discuss and evaluate your books and proposals. Details about how to register for this event can be found on the convention website.

The Dealers' Room opens at 1:00pm and there will be light programming from 2:00pm onwards. The official Opening Ceremonies are at 6:30pm, following a dinner break, and programming will continue through the evening.

Canadian publishing imprint ChiZine will launch a number of new titles with a party from 8:00-10:00pm, and Ramsey Campbell will be giving one of his peerless ghost story readings from 11:00pm until midnight.

Registration opens at 9:00am on the Friday, and the Art Show opens at Noon. Among the day's programming highlights are interviews with Guests of Honour Tanith Lee, Dave Carson and Hugh Lamb, a reading and Q&A with Brian Lumley, a look at horror videogaming, a panel on how to get an agent, a screening of Let the Right One In with writer John Ajvide Lindqvist, and the Mass Autographing.

Launches include Robinson Publishing's The Best of Best New Horror, Mortbury Press' The Black Book of Horror #6, Dark Arts' When the

# Night Comes Down, plus multiple new titles from Ash-Tree Press, NewCon Press, PS Publishing, and Heather Graham and Christopher Fowler will both be hosting major parties during in the evening. Or, if you prefer, you can be entertained by the first performance of Reggie Oliver's The Phantom Gaslight Music Hall.

Saturday kicks off with a panel on how to promote yourself and your work, followed by discussions on selling foreign rights, a history of the *Pan Book of Horror Stories*, women in horror, anthologies of the past, how to sell your book, and a state of the genre panel featuring some of the biggest names in horror.

There will also be interviews with Special Guests of Honours James Herbert, David Case and Ingrid Pitt.

Telos Publishing will be hosting a Tea Party in the morning to promote two new titles, Peter and Nicky Crowther will be launching their new poetry imprint Stanza, there is a signing for Nancy Kilpatrick's new vampire anthology Evolve, and Transworld is hosting a launch for Jasper Kent's latest alternate history novel.

For fans of the *Pan Book of Horror* series, we will also be hosting a special signing featuring the following original contributors **David Case** (#11-#15, #19, #22), **Basil Copper** (#5, #6, #8), **Christopher Fowler** (#28, #30), **Craig Herbertson** (#29), **Samantha Lee** (#18, #27), **Tanith Lee** (#9), **David A. Riley** (#11), **Tony Richards** (#22), **Nicholas Royle** (#26), **Harry E. Turner** (#11, #13-#18, #20-#23, #26, #27) and cover artist **Steve Crisp** (#26), and there will also be special signings with **Guy N. Smith**, **Graham Masterton** and **James Herbert**, along with possibly some surprise guests.

Following the Art Show Reception from 5:00-6:30pm, where you will have the opportunity to meet many of the talented artists who are displaying their work over the weekend, the prestigious Horror Writers Association Bram Stoker Awards Banquet will be held in the Palm Court restaurant on the Pier, hosted by

Mistress of Ceremonies Jo Fletcher. The WHC Grand Master Award winner will also be announced at the presentation, which will follow the traditional fish and chips meal (and must be booked in advance).

Following the Stoker Awards, there will be major parties hosted by Quercus and the HWA, Stephen Volk will be introducing a rare screening of his terrifying TV docudrama *Ghostwatch*, or you can take in another performance of The Phantom Gaslight Music Hall.



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
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


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
